## **Article V – Purpose (IRS-Compliant Language)**

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Specifically, the corporation is formed to support the successful reentry of individuals listed on the Florida Sex Offender Registry by facilitating access to employment opportunities, educational resources, and community support. The corporation will carry out its mission through job listing services, anonymous employer outreach, direct support programming, and educational tools for both job seekers and hiring organizations.

# **Article VI - Prohibition Against Private Inurement**

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article V.

#### **Article VII - Dissolution Clause**

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be distributed to the State of Florida or a local government for a public purpose, or to another nonprofit organization recognized as tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3).
