How to Use ChatGPT for Resumes

Use prompts like:

- "Write a resume for someone returning to work after 5 years, with experience in food service and warehouse work."
- "Help me explain that I completed a GED and participated in a vocational training program while incarcerated."

#### You can also ask ChatGPT to:

- Reword your work history more professionally
- Tailor your resume for a specific job posting
- Generate bullet points based on job titles

Tip: Keep things honest — but don't be afraid to highlight soft skills like punctuality, teamwork, and adaptability.


#### Step 3: Get Ready for Interviews

#### What to Expect in an Interview

- Questions about your work experience, problem solving, or attendance
- "Behavioral" questions (Tell me about a time when...)
- Situational questions (What would you do if...)
- Possible questions about background or gaps
- ✓ Tip: Be honest, but focus on what you've learned and how you've grown. Use phrases like:





"Since that time, I've focused on rebuilding and becoming a dependable, motivated worker."
